PE and Sport Grant Overview

What is PE and Sport Premium?

The government provides funding to improve physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Each school receives approximately £8000 each year. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport.

For 2015 - 2016 Castle Hill received £8825 which was spent on:

- Further CPD and staff training
- Continued provision of after school clubs
- The introduction of a wider range of after school clubs e.g. Golf and Dodge Ball
- Competing in internal and external competitions
- High quality PE coaching from professional companies
- Longer and more targeted swimming lessons for KS2

The impact of this has been:

- Higher quality of provision in P.E
- Pupils having access to a wider range of after school clubs
- Opportunities to try new sports and activities
- Children competing in even more inter-school competitions
- Children are generally more physically active

For 2016 - 2017 Castle Hill will receive approximately £8000 plus £5 per pupil. This will be spent on:

- Further CPD and staff training for new teachers
- Continued provision of a range of after school clubs
- Competing in internal and external competitions
- High quality coaching from professional companies
- Swimming lessons for KS2 children who cannot swim 25 metres
- Introduction of 'The Daily Mile' – an initiative to increase daily physical activity
- Developing an understanding of healthy eating and exercise and how these impact on well-being
- Visit to and membership of Wigan Youth Zone for all KS2 children to increase participation in out of school activities
